## Jasmine, Asiatic (spp.)

**Leaf Color** Green  
**Fall Color** No change in fall color

### Leaf Identification

**Type:** Simple  
**Arrangement:** Opposite  
**Venations:** Brachidodrome and pinnate  
**Margins:** Entire  
**Shapes:** Ovate  
**Length:** Less than 2in./5cm

This plant rarely fruits.

### *Trachelospermum asiaticum*

Asiatic Jasmine, Small Leaf Confederate Jasmine

### Apocynaceae (Dogbane)

**Type** Groundcover, vine, woody plant

**Hardy range** 7B to 10A  
**Height** 12" to 24" / 30cm to 60cm  
**Spread** 6' to 15' / 1.80m to 4.60m  
**Growth rate** Fast  
**Form** Prostrate, spreading or horizontal and variable spread  
**Exposure** Full shade to full sun  
**Persistence** Evergreen  
**Bloom Color** Yellow

The flowers are fragrant.

### Native Habitat

Japan, Korea

### Crown, Branch and Twig

This plant is symmetrical with a fine texture and has a dense crown. Branches or twigs are thin.

This plant has low flammability.

### Pests, Diseases and Damaging Agents

Pests: Scales, red spider mite, or whiteflies followed by sooty mold can be a minor problem for jasmine.

### Environment

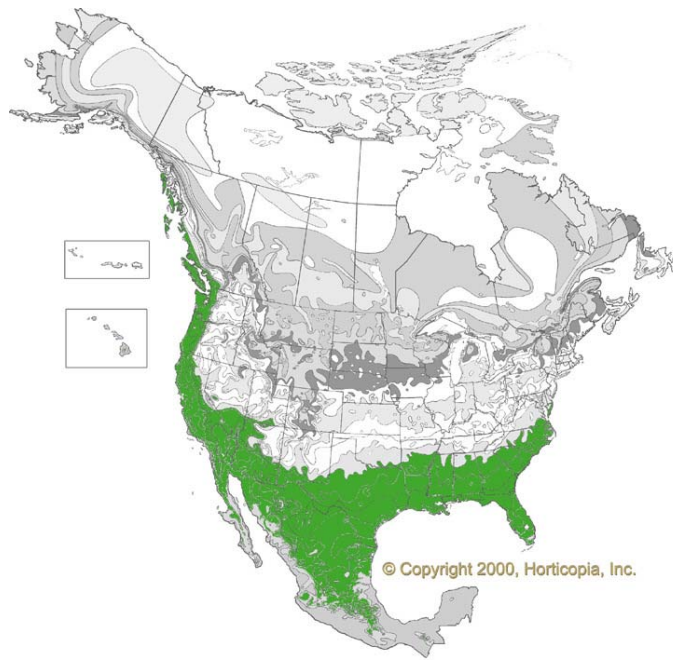
This plant tolerates some drought and salt well. This plant will grow in dry soil. Suitable soil is well-drained/loamy, sandy or clay. The pH preference is an acidic to alkaline (less than 6.8 to more than 7.7) soil.
