# Magnolia 'Jane'

**Leaf Color** Green  
**Fall Color** Copper

## Leaf Identification

**Type:** Simple  
**Arrangement:** Alternate  
**Venations:** Brachidodrome and pinnate  
**Margins:** Entire and undulate  
**Shapes:** Elliptic and obovate  
**Length:** 4in./10cm to 8in./20cm

**Fruit Color** Red

This plant rarely fruits.

**Type** Shrub, woody plant

**Hardy range** 3A to 7A  
**Height** 10' to 15' / 3.00m to 4.60m  
**Spread** 6' to 10' / 1.80m to 3.00m  
**Growth rate** Slow  
**Form** Oval, rounded and upright or erect  
**Exposure** Partial shade or partial sun to full sun  
**Persistence** Deciduous

**Bloom Color** Purple and red  
**Bloom Time** Spring and Summer

The flowers are very showy.

**Native Habitat**  
Hybrid origin

**Crown, Branch and Twig**  
This plant is asymmetrical with a coarse texture and has an open crown.  
This plant's bark is showy.  
Branches or twigs are of medium thickness.  
This plant is often grown with multiple trunks.

This plant has low flammability.

**Pests, Diseases and Damaging Agents**  
Scales are the main problem on plants in the Magnolia family.

## Environment

This plant tolerates some drought.  
This plant will grow in dry soil.  
Suitable soil is well-drained/loamy, sandy or clay.  
The pH preference is an acidic to slightly alkaline (less than 6.8 to 7.7) soil.

## Attributes and Features

- Inconspicuous fruit
- Fruit is edible by birds
